VIVOS SHELTER PROJECT TAKES SHAPE

SOLUTION FOR SURVIVAL TO BE COMPLETED BY 2011

Los Angeles, CA – (December 21, 2009). VIVOS (www.terravivos.com) today announced the commencement of construction of a nationwide network of VIVOS shelters. The VIVOS Project was born of the realization that there are multiple scenarios, both natural and man-made, that can be globally catastrophic to life on Earth. Multiple and varied sources throughout history, from the Mayans, Christianity, Judaism, Freemasonry, the Hopi Indians, Nostradamus, Edgar Cayce, and many ancient cultures separated by thousands of miles, have targeted December 21, 2012 as a potential date for an Earth changing event.

“We are delighted with the progress to date and excited to be able to share the first physical representation of our long term vision to create a solution for survival,” stated Robert K. Vicino, VIVOS Founder and Managing Director. “These shelters have been almost twenty years in the making and represent the most state-of-the-art, advanced technical and engineering design available, with each location selected for its proximity, within 200 miles of the nation’s major metropolitan areas, providing convenient and safe access, requiring just a few hours notice of a life-threatening event.”

The United States and most major world governments have long recognized the vital need for deep underground emergency facilities in which to house key government personnel during significant natural or man-made catastrophes. Unfortunately, these shelters have exclusively been built for the personnel at the highest levels of government, with no provisions made for the general public. The VIVOS shelter network will provide an opportunity for life assurance for civilians who want to ensure survival and protection for themselves and their loved ones, with a modern day Noah’s Ark.

The VIVOS shelters are being constructed in a shipyard, overseen by Master Naval Architect, Jason Kao. The revolutionary underground shelters are composed of heavy reinforced, hardened steel modules, designed to withstand a 50 megaton blast within 10 miles, a series of force 10 earthquakes, 450 MPH surface winds, a 1,000,000 volt electromagnetic pulse (EMP), and flooding submersion for up to 500 hours. Once each shelter cluster is completed they will be shipped to their high altitude sites, quickly assembled on their foundations, outfitted and fully stocked, thirty feet below the surface.

Vivos visionaries include Science Director, Dr. Nick Poulos, and a team of professionals with expertise in health support, dietary, quality of life systems, hospitality, innovative technology, structural and seismic engineers from the University of California, San

Diego (UCSD), security and defense, maintenance and strategic planning. This dream team of diverse professional minds has overseen the development of the interior accommodations that will provide the ultimate in residential comfort and luxury in self-sustained underground living for up to one year. Each 19,000 square foot Vivos shelter offers amenities such as separate living quarters, living rooms, kitchens, a theater, group gathering areas, lounges, offices, libraries, computer nooks, exercise equipment, a medical and dental facility, and communications and security offices with extensive state-of-the-art facility defenses.

With the completion of the first shelter in early 2011, the VIVOS Project will include a network of 20 identical hardened shelters, located up and down the Sierras, the Rockies and the Adirondacks. A detailed virtual tour of the VIVOS shelter can be found at www.terravivos.com.
